As they searched for V.C. to smile.

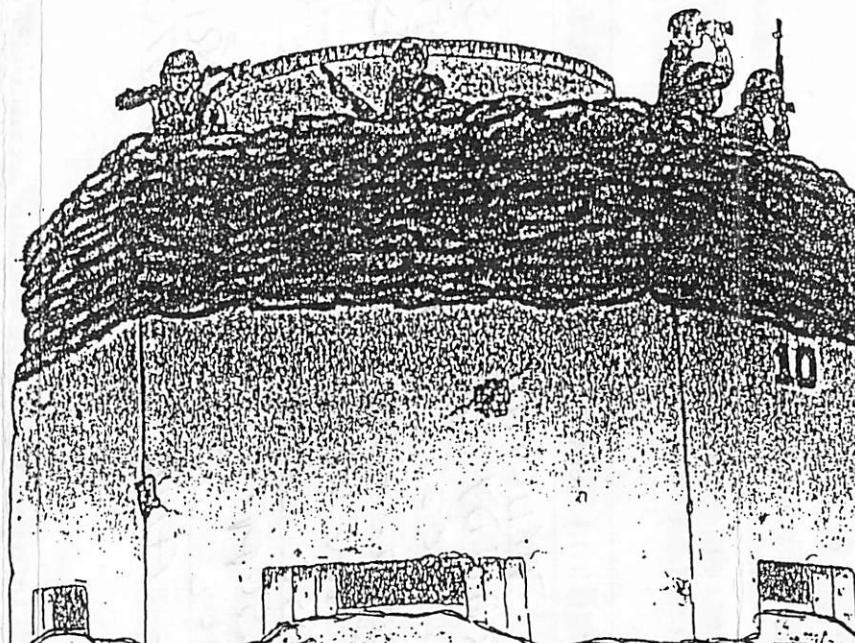
The V.C. poured through the wire,
